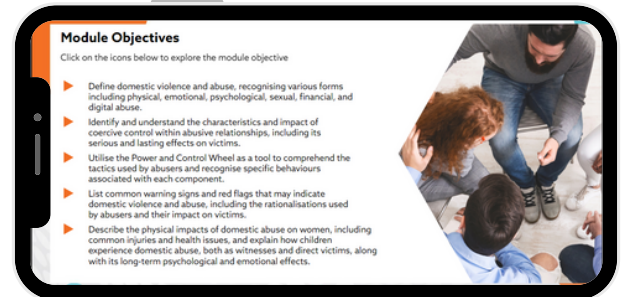


# Domestic Violence and Abuse Awareness Module 2
